A Note From the Rector



Love Language The Rev. Mother Nina Bacas

I missed you on St. Bart's Weekend because we were at our son's wedding just north of Lake Tahoe. It was a "destination wedding," so we were all together in a lodge for the whole weekend. Many speeches were delivered about the bride and groom, but what surprised me most was how one groomsman described our son's love of cooking as his "love language."

In the year most of these groomsmen were born (1992), Gary Chapman authored *The Five Love Languages*, which addresses the different ways that people express their love for one another. Since there are many ways to convey the words "I love you," it's important to know someone's love language so that you don't miss when they "speak" it. In my son's case, though, it would be hard to miss a wild mushroom pizza made from scratch as it cooks over a campfire!

Undoubtedly, the skill of detecting love languages is essential for our relationships with each other. But God is the ultimate "love linguist," since all love comes from God. So, can you detect God's love language in your life? Like everyone, when we get overwhelmed, or underwhelmed, in our daily lives, we risk missing God's expression. But it's always there—unwavering. I wonder, can you name the love language(s) God uses with you, personally? And can you hold on to that, in good times and bad? If you are not sure how God shows love to you, your faith community at St. Bart's is here to assist. For God's love language is our everything—for better or worse, for richer or poorer, in sickness and in health ... and through eternity.



The <u>Season of Creation</u> starts this Sunday, September 1, the Day of Prayer for Creation! During this annual ecumenical celebration, faith communities around the world pray and act together to honor and protect the Earth, our common home. The celebration runs throughout the month and ends officially on October 4, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology beloved by many Christian denominations. But this year at St. Bart's, we're extending the season through the October 5-6 weekend, when we celebrate the


Blessing of the Animals.

Bible Study: "Gnosticism: From Nag Hammadi to the Gospel of Judas"

New session starts Wednesday, September 11, 10 a.m.-noon, Zoom

Beginning on Wednesday, September 11, join Bill Zettinger and Bob Capettini as they conduct a weekly Zoom Bible study based on a DVD series on Gnosticism. Classes will last about 12 weeks, and notes will be provided each week.

In the first three centuries after Jesus, there existed various forms of Christianity that were very different from what would later become the Christian orthodoxy that we practice today. Gnostics had a differing view of Christianity. They were seeking direct knowledge of God. They offered salvation from ignorance and fate through knowledge of a higher God, who was greater than the one who created our universe. This higher God sent Jesus, and they claimed that people could have mystical personal contact with that God right now.



- Learn about the Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty and other advocacy actions you can take on behalf of the environment




