
The Fruit of the Holy Spirit:






ST. BART'S POPS SERIES:


New Sacred Ground Circle Forming 12-session series starting Wednesday, October 22, 3-5 p.m., Zoom




Jacob's Ordination Saturday, October 25, 1 p.m., Sanctuary


